Dear Friends,

Each new school year brings with it a sense of freshness and excitement. While we may be returning to a familiar building, each child enters school on her first day back in anticipation of a new classroom, a new teacher and a new opportunity to shine.

I have always appreciated that just a few short weeks (sometimes less), into the school year, we also begin the Torah cycle anew. I enjoy viewing the most familiar narratives of the Torah with fresh eyes and a new perspective. And I never fail to learn new lessons.

In Parshat Lech Lecha, our forefather Avraham sheds the light of monotheism in the world and helps people to understand their Creator and what He asks of us. In return, Hashem will always harbor good will towards Avraham and his offspring (that's us), sharing Avraham's eternal reward with subsequent generations.

In describing the legacy that Avraham is destined to create, he is told to walk outside and gaze to the heavens "הבט נא השמימה וספר הכוכבים" (Please look heavenward and count the stars...so shall be your offspring). In its basic understanding this is meant to convey the vast numbers of descendants that will follow from Avraham's lineage (the very name Avraham is an acronym for Av Hamon Goyim – father to a multitude of nations), that his offspring would be "as numerous as the stars in the sky." However, Rabbeinu Bachya, the 11th century commentator, adds another layer of meaning to the verse.

Rabbeinu Bachya explains that the comparison between Avraham's children and the stars in the sky moves far beyond just the numbers. Just as each star in the sky is unique, so too, each and every child is unique. Some stars appear larger, some smaller.



Some shine brighter in the spring and others in the fall. Still, each and every point of light is a necessary component in the mosaic of the universe. Each star impacts the others around it and its absence would have an immeasurable impact in the fabric of space.

Similarly, each one of us, Avraham's children, has a unique light that we are meant to share with the universe. No two of us can fill the exact same role, and no two children are alike either. As parents and educators, we must hold this truth forward and help each and every child identify his or her unique gifts; the light that they must share with the world.

At VHA, we do not view education as fitting children into a particular mold. Rather, it is our mission to help them find their unique place from where they will shine light upon the entire world.

Our students are always strongly represented in the winners' circle of the Jewish Federation's Annual Public Speaking Contest

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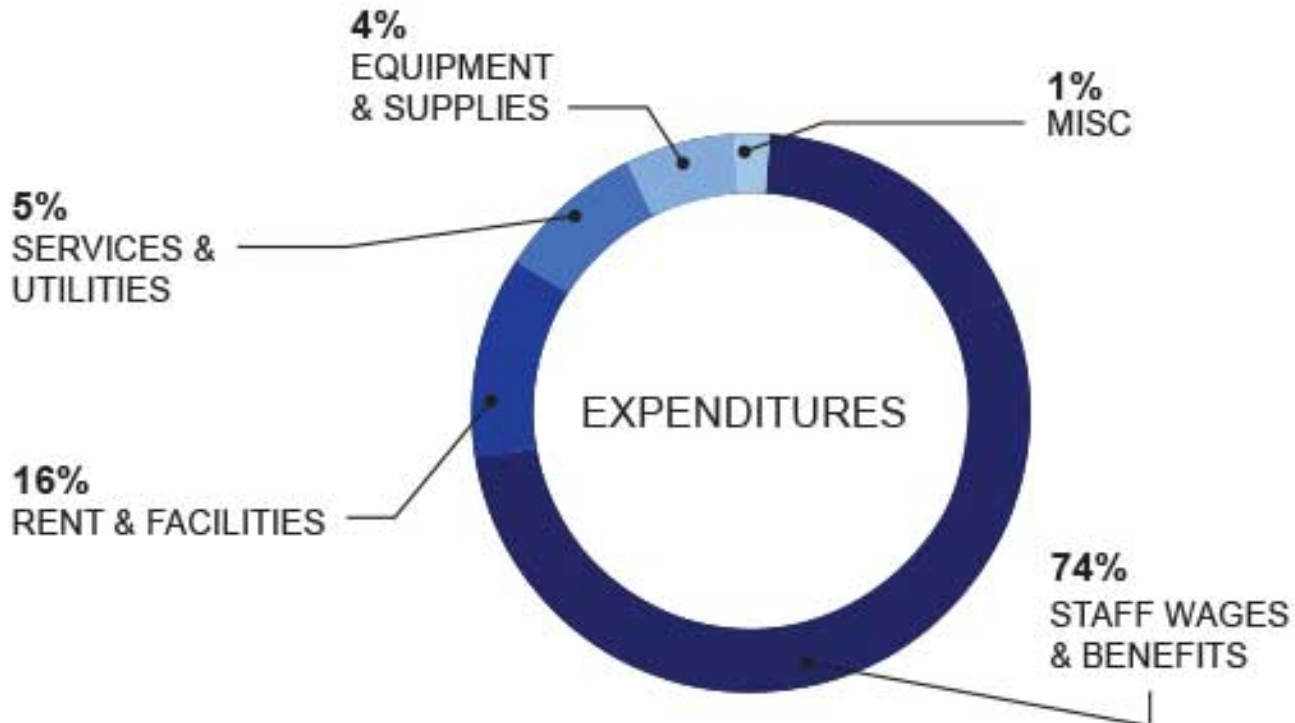
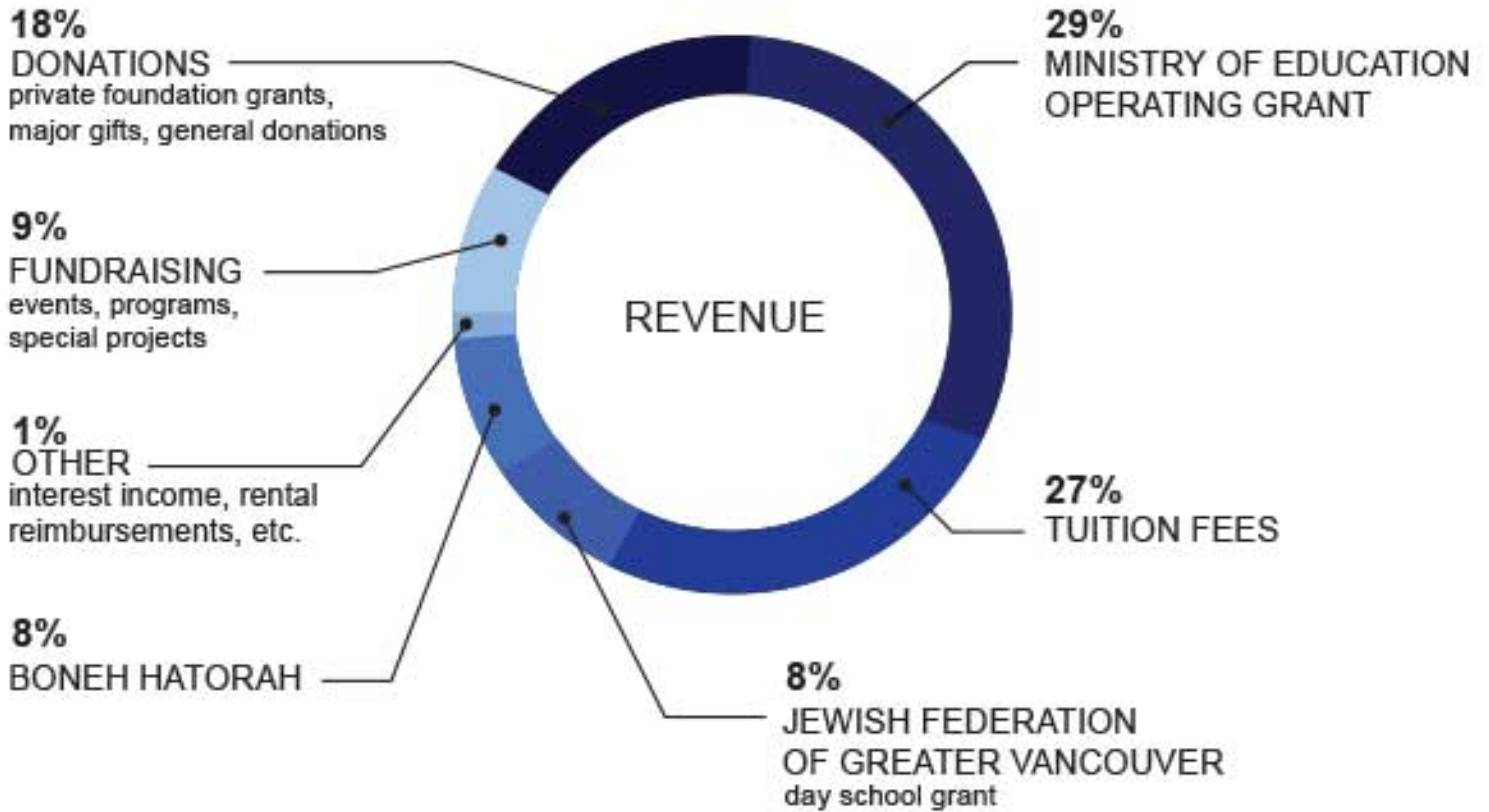
